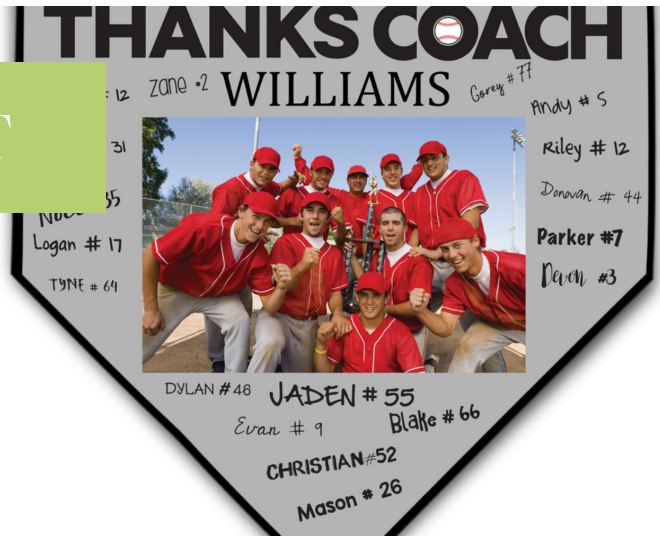


PERSONALIZED GIFTS
